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TechLaw Secures Key \$10.8 Million EPA Task Order Award; Continues to Hold Top Spot as EPA Small Business Environmental Contractor

Company has won 54 Task Orders worth more than \$60 million since 2018

CHANTILLY, Va. (October 23, 2025) – The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has awarded environmental consulting firm TechLaw a \$10.8 million task order to conduct significant Superfund remediation oversight work nationwide over the next four years. The award—one of the largest individual contracts issued under a specialized contract vehicle for small businesses—solidifies TechLaw's position as the single largest awardee under the EPA Remedial Action Framework-Environmental Services and Operations (RAF-ESO) program, both in total task order awards and in dollar value of those awards.

"Once again, we are heartened by EPA's confidence in the scientific and technical expertise of the TechLaw Team," says TechLaw Chief Operating Officer Patricia Derocher. "We are happy to be leading the way for EPA under ESO, and we look forward to building on that history of success for such an important environmental program."

With this most recent award, TechLaw will support EPA's Washington, D.C.-based Federal Facilities Restoration and Reuse Office (FFRRO) by providing expert technical support for government environmental remediation operations and oversight at both Federally owned and formerly Federally owned National Priority List (NPL) and Non-NPL sites nationwide. TechLaw will support EPA primarily by providing critical document reviews to ensure that hazardous

waste remediation at numerous regulated locations across the country proceeds according to EPA direction. The task order award runs through mid-2029.

Launched in 2018, the RAF-ESO contract is open to 21 qualified small-businesses—including TechLaw—to compete nationwide on individual task orders to support EPA Superfund cleanup programs via technical oversight work, including: field work and analytical support, remedy operations (including long-term response actions), and preliminary assessment/site investigation activities. The ESO contract runs through 2028.
